**Parade begins at Ala Moana Park's Magic Island parking lot
and ends at Kapiolani Park Bandstand.**

The day before he was assassinated in 1968, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. delivered a speech in support of striking sanitation workers at Mason Temple in Memphis, Tennessee. The labor strike was to protest unfair wages, unsafe working conditions, and the city's refusal to recognize their union chapter, Local 1733 of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME).



Please join our fellow HGEA/AFSCME LOCAL 152 sisters and brothers on January 16, 2017, as we march in remembrance of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr's fight for equality, fairness and justice for all.

The length of the parade is approximately 3.0 miles and moves at a moderate pace. HGEA will provide a **free bus service** from Waikiki Shell **starting at 7:00 a.m. running in 15-minute intervals with the last pickup at 7:40 a.m.**
